A self-described introvert with a public profession, Dasan Ahanu is an award-winning cultural organizer, artist, and scholar based in North Carolina. As a cultural leader and poet, Dasan has appeared on NPR, TV One's *Verses and Flow*, and the documentary *Poet Son*. Through his projects and appointments, he highlights North Carolina's creative artistry. He has served as a resident artist at St. Joseph's Historic Foundation/Hayti Heritage Center and as Rothwell Mellon Program Director for Creative Futures with Carolina Performing Arts. He directs the Jambalaya Soul Slam, founded the Bull City Slam Team, and co-directs Black Poetry Theatre, a company producing original theatrical works.


Dasan's writing has been published extensively, and he is the author of seven poetry collections. His most recent collection, *Concrete Jungle Allegories*, was the winner of the Unsung Pots Award from Jacar Press and Sable Books. He has performed across the country, sharing his unique blend of storytelling and critical analysis. He has also competed in regional and national competitions with the Bull City Slam team. Dasan is a teaching artist who has crafted and facilitated poetry workshops for writers of disparate ages and backgrounds.

A respected recording artist, Dasan has collaborated with many Jazz, Soul, and Hip-Hop artists in North Carolina. He is a member of the Recording Academy and has released a variety of singles and albums commercially. He is also known for blending spoken word, soul, Hip Hop, and jazz with his band Eloquent Soul.

Dasan has worked with multiple educational institutions, teaching courses on Hip-Hop, Creative Writing, and Black culture. Among the many great honors throughout his career, Dasan was a Nasir Jones Fellow with the Marcyliena H. Morgan Hip Hop Archive & Research Institute at Harvard University's Hutchins Center for African & African American Research. In 2023, he was named the 15th Piedmont Laureate for his poetry. His work in the arts as a curator, program developer, and administrator led to his recognition as a 2023-2024 National Leaders of Color Fellow (curated by Creative West). Dasan is currently a Southern Fellow with the International Society for the Performing Arts, exploring the impact of the performing arts globally.
